





FLASH and FUNDAMENTALS

It's early Spring so many of us have been watching a lot of basketball lately. Me, too. Watching the games, I'm amazed sometimes by so many players in today's college game who lack the basic skills of dribbling, rebounding, and boxing out. The list of the skills they lack goes on. They have a lot of FLASH but few FUNDAMENTALS.

Fundamentals are essential, especially the Christian faith. The Apostle Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians outlines the basics.

Now I would remind you, brethren, in what terms I preached to you the gospel, which you received, in which you stand, by which you are saved, if you hold it fast -- unless you believed in vain. For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve . . . then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me.

Too many Christians are long on FLASH and short on FUNDAMENTALS. Paul's words remind us of the Easter Fundamentals:

Go to the Cross – we have to die to self

Go to the Tomb – He is risen from the grave, there is hope!

Go to the World – share His love, and tell your story of His presence in you!

May All the Blessings of Easter be yours, PCC!

Notes From Tim

"Fairest Lord Jesus" is one of my favorite Easter hymns. It is a beautiful poetic meditation on the nature of Jesus Christ. Philippians 2: 5-11 --- "Christ Jesus, who though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited. But he emptied himself, being born in human likeness and being found in human form, humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross. God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name. So that at the name of Jesus, every knee should bow in heaven and on earth and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

- 1. Fairest Lord Jesus, ruler of all nature, O thou of God and man the Son, Thee will I cherish, Thee will I honor, thou, my soul's glory, joy, and crown.
- 2. Fair are the meadows, fairer still the woodlands, robed in the blooming garb of spring: Jesus is fairer, Jesus is purer who makes the woeful heart to sing.
- 3. Fair is the sunshine, fairer still the moonlight, and all the twinkling starry host: Jesus shines brighter, Jesus shines purer than all the angels heaven can boast.
 - 4. Beautiful Savior! Lord of all the nations! Son of God and Son of Man! Glory and honor, praise, adoration, now and forevermore be thine.

In 1873, Lutheran minister Joseph Augustus Seiss translated this hymn text. Seiss was born in 1823, in Graceham, Maryland, to German parents of Moravian heritage. He entered the Lutheran clergy after graduation in 1848 from Gettysburg College and Seminary of Pennsylvania. A prolific author, he wrote on religious topics, books of the Bible and the assassination of President Abraham Lincoln. He served in several prominent positions in the Lutheran Church in Pennsylvania until his death is 1904. This hymn has stood the test of time for over three hundred years and still continues to be sung. The tune enchants the heart, and the text transcends time. What could be more beautiful than meadows with flowers in springtime, sun beams, or twinkling stars? Jesus, our "ruler of all nature." He "shines purer than all the angels heaven can boast"!

Grace and peace to you as we together celebrate the beauty of springtime and the glory of our Risen Savior Jesus Christ our everlasting Lord! ~Tim
