

Notes From Tim

Carol: Mary's Little Boy Child

Joseph Hairston (July 9, 1901 - January 18, 2000) was an American composer, songwriter, choral conductor, and actor. He was regarded as a leading expert on spirituals and choral music. His notable Christmas composition was "Mary's Little Boy Child" that our Handbell Choir will play at this year's Christmas Evening of Music Program on December 11. Also, this beloved Christmas carol is traditionally sung as a solo each year at our church's Christmas Eve Service.

Incidentally, Hairston was born (not far from Pfafftown) in Belews Creek NC, a rural community on the border of Stokes, Forsyth, Rockingham and Guilford counties in North Carolina! At an early age, he and his family moved to Homestead, Pennsylvania, just outside Pittsburgh, where he graduated from high school in 1920. Hairston, who gave up studies at Massachusetts Agricultural College in the 1920s, went on to graduate from Tufts University in 1928 and studied music at the Juilliard School of Music. Hairston pledged Kappa Alpha Psi (Chi Chapter) in 1925. He worked as a choir conductor in the early stages of his career. His work with choirs on Broadway eventually led to his singing and acting in plays, films, radio programs, and television shows. Hairston wrote this beautiful song "Mary's Little Boy Child" in 1956, and set the melody to a rhythmic Calypso style accompaniment. The text is as

Long time ago in Bethlehem, so the Holy Bible said, Mary's boy child Jesus Christ, was born on Christmas Day.

While shepherds watch their flocks by night, they see a bright new shining star, they hear a choir sing a song, the music seemed to come from afar.

Now Joseph and his wife, Mary, came to Bethlehem that night, they found no place to bear her child, not a single room was in sight.

And then they found a little nook in a stable all forlorn, and in a manger cold and dark, Mary's little boy child was born.

Hark, now hear the angels sing, a new king was born today, and man will live for evermore, because of Christmas Day! Mary's boy child Jesus Christ, was born on Christmas Day!

What a wondrous gift our loving God gave to the world on that glorious morn so many years ago! God's grace, peace, and joy be with you always.
