



A NOTE FROM RODNEY

And when did we see thee sick or in prison and visit thee?' And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to Me.'



Please join us on Wednesday, February 22, at 6:30 p.m. as we celebrate Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday is always celebrated 46 days before Easter Sunday and is the solemn reminder of human mortality and the need for reconciliation with God. Ash Wednesday also marks the beginning of the Lenten Season. Lent references the time Jesus spent being tempted in the desert. This time seeks to prepare the heart of us for the solemn remembrance of the death of Jesus followed by a joyous Easter Sunday celebration of the resurrection.

During our Ash Wednesday Service a mark of the sign of the cross will be placed on the believer's forehead with ash. This cross symbolizes our sinful nature and our need for salvation. The use of ashes in the Bible was used to illustrate mourning, repentance and the frailty of humanity. - Tim



CWF NEWS

CWF met on January 17th at 6:00pm in the downstairs Fellowship Hall. We discussed outreach plans for coming months.

On February 8th we will be preparing and delivering a meal to the Salvation Army Center of Hope Family Shelter which provides meals and shelter for homeless parents with children. This is the only family emergency shelter in Forsyth County.

During December we collected \$1,045 for the Senior Services Meals on Wheels Program. We voted to add enough to those funds to cover the cost of providing meals for one senior for one year. Current cost is \$1,920--CWF will be sending \$875 to the Meals on Wheels program.

We voted to give \$300 to Evelyn to purchase fabric for the bags she makes for Newborns In Need. In the planning phase: Visiting a nursing home and bringing needed items to the residents. We are gathering information to cook a meal for the Ronald Macdonald House in WS.

We are not meeting in February but will be delivering a meal to Center of Hope Family Shelter as our February activity.

Notes From Tim

Lord, Speak to Me

This particular anthem is one of the most cherished anthems the Chancel Choir likes to sing in Sunday worship. Frances Ridley Havergal, the author of this text has often been called the "consecration poet" because of her deep commitment to Christ. This text first appeared in 1872 in leaflet form with the title A Worker's Prayer accompanied by the Scripture verse: "For none of us lives to himself and none dies to himself' (Romans 14:17). These words have since been widely used in leading others to a deeper consecration of their lives to God:

> Lord, speak to me that I may speak *In living echoes of Thy tone;* As Thou hast sought, so let me seek Thy erring children lost and lone.

O teach me, Lord, that I may teach *The precious things Thou dost impart;* And wing my words, that they may reach The hidden depths of many a heart.

O fill me with Thy fullness, Lord, Until my very heart overflow *In kindling thought and glowing word* Thy love to tell, Thy praise to show.

O use me, Lord, use even me, *Just as Thou wilt and when and where;* Until Thy blessed face I see, Thy rest, Thy joy, Thy glory share. Amen.

Effective service must always begin with prayer asking God to use us to accomplish His eternal purposes in the lives of others. But we must not dictate to our Lord as to how and when we should be used. We are simply to speak His truth boldly but always in love. Asking lost people to be reconciled to God is far different from merely engaging them in theological arguments. We must always remember that the real need of people is to hear about the historical Christ as a personal Savior and Lord and to be guided to a living and vital relationship with Him.

Our Chancel Choir will be singing this anthem in the morning worship service on Sunday, February 5.
