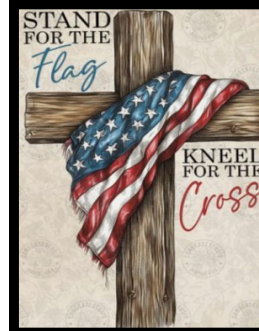

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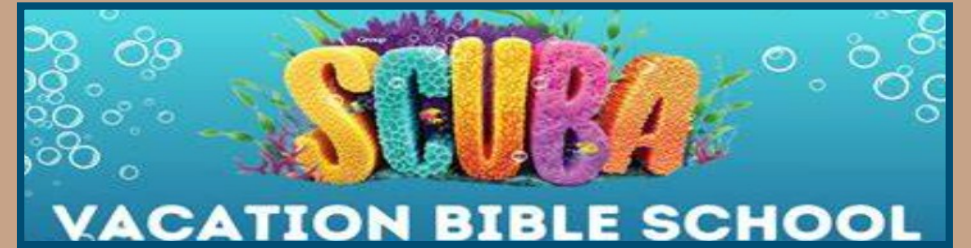

company. It's the best way of walking.

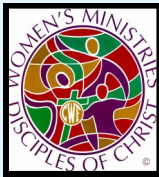

Notes from Tim

As I make preparations for our church VBS at PCC
on August 2, my mind reverts back to the wonderful
memories of Bible Schools I attended as a child and
those special VBS songs that have continued to live
in my heart and mind all these years! One of those
that comes to mind is "*Deep and Wide*" (along with
hand motions of course)! It continues to be a VBS
popular song with kids today:

*Deep and wide, deep and wide there's a fountain
flowing deep and wide.
Deep and wide, deep and wide, there's a fountain
flowing deep and wide.*

The text of this song is taken from John 4: 5-13

*"So he (Jesus) came to a town of Samaria which was
named Sychar, near to the bit of land which Jacob gave
to his son Joseph: Now Jacob's fountain was there.
Jesus, being tired after his journey, was resting by the
fountain. It was about the sixth hour. A woman of
Samaria came to get water, and Jesus said to her, Give
me some water. For his disciples had gone to the town
to get food. The woman of Samaria said to him, Why do
you, a Jew, make a request for water to me, a woman
of Samaria? She said this because Jews have nothing
to do with the people of Samaria. In answer Jesus said,
If you had knowledge of what God gives freely and who
it is who says to you, Give me water, you would make
your prayer to him, and he would give you living water.
The woman said to him, Sir, you have no vessel and the
fountain is deep; from where will you get the living
water? Are you greater than our father Jacob who
gave us the fountain and took the water of it himself,
with his children and his cattle? Jesus said to her,
Everyone who takes this water will be in need of it
again: But whoever takes the water I give him will
never be in need of drink again; for the water I give
him will become in him a fountain of eternal life. The
woman said to him, Sir, give me this water, so that I
may not be in need again of drink and will not have to
come all this way for it."*

Mr. Sidney E. Cox, 1887-1975, composed this song.
In 1907, Cox moved from England to Canada. In 1908
he joined the Methodist church but soon converted to
the Salvation Army, where he worked from the years
1909 until 1944, eventually becoming a Major. After
he left the Salvation Army he devoted his focus to
evangelistic revival work. Over the course of his life,
he authored or composed approximately 400 songs.

May our church family be in prayer for our children,
teachers, and helpers as they share God's message of
His everlasting fountain of water and life!
