

# An Influential Father

Have you ever wondered about the less familiar names in the Bible? Many people are mentioned just once—often in a genealogy and identified only as "the father of ..." But one lesser-known father is mentioned 11 times in the Gospels and always in association with his sons. His name is Zebedee, and he's the father of two of Christ's disciples.

All we know is that he was a fisherman in Galilee, the father of James and John, and the husband of Salome (Matt. 27:56; Mark 15:40). Although there is no



mention of Zebedee following Jesus, perhaps his influence is seen in the fact that his sons and his wife loved their Messiah and were faithful to Him (Matt. 20:20). Zebedee accomplished what every Christian father should aspire to achieve—he raised his children to follow Christ. What greater joy could we have than to see our sons and daughters walking with Jesus, not just in the early years but even after they grow up and leave home? The key to this kind of influence is the example we set for our family. No matter what we say, it's our actions that reveal who we really are and what we truly believe. 


Meal & Produce Distribution: H.O.P.E. prepares and distributes nutritious meals & fresh produce to 32 sites throughout Winston-Salem every weekend. Our decision to distribute on weekends is to ensure a child has a healthy meal before starting school on Mondays, so that they are able to learn and focus. To date, we have provided over 354,000 meals to children and over 600,000 pounds of fresh produce to their families since our inception in 2014.



## Notes from Tim

Hymn Story: When They Ring Those Golden Bells

One of my grandpa Motsinger's favorite hymns was "When They Ring Those Golden Bells For You and Me." This once very popular hymn is not often heard these days, but it has great meaning for each of us as Christians when we think of Heaven and how beautiful it must be. Jesus is there, first and foremost; and with each passing year, more of the ones we love have gone there. Yes, we can only imagine how beautiful Heaven must be!

In 1887, Daniel A. Marbelle wrote this poem adding his melody, and left us a song about a beautiful place he anticipated seeing one day. Marbelle was born in France. By 1847, we find him in the American Navy fighting Mexico; in 1862, in the Civil War as a musician with the sixth Michigan infantry regiment; and after the war, touring the country in an opera company. Daniel was involved with the Barnum and Bailey Circus for a time and with Colonel William Cody, better known as "Buffalo Bill," and his Wild West Show. And if that wasn't enough, Marbelle was an outstanding public speaker, a poet, a sleight of hand artist, and composer of popular ballads.

With all these talents, Daniel Marbelle should have died as a rich and famous man, but this was not the case. His last years were spent depending on others—his home an abandoned schoolhouse, his neighbors providing sustenance; but each time Marbelle shared his testimony in the little Methodist Church near Elgin, Illinois, where he sang in the choir, he would say, "For years I was too busy. I didn't have time for God and so rich I didn't need Him. God had to slow me down and take my success away so that He could talk to me about the home beyond the river."

With a life of fame and fortune behind him and a promise of a "land beyond the river" before him, Daniel A. Marbelle, a sinner saved by grace, soared far beyond the pull of earth's ties. With pen in hand, he recorded for us who wait in Christ the word picture of how beautiful Heaven must be:

There's a land beyond the river,
That we call the sweet forever,
And we only reach that shore by faith's decree;
One by one we'll gain the portals,
There to dwell with the immortals,
When they ring those golden bells for you and me.

#### Chorus:

Don't you hear the bells now ringing?
Don't you hear the angels singing?
'Tis the glory hallelujah Jubilee.
In that far off sweet forever,
Just beyond the shining river,
When they ring the golden bells for you and me.

Recently, I found myself (like everyone) searching my heart and the Scriptures for things that just didn't make sense to me. not intervene, it left me with mind consuming doubts and confusion.

I began searching, praying and seeking Him more than usual. Through my prayers and studying, I realized that there will just be times when there will be no easy solutions or answers to the why's that my frail, human mind was searching for. I was being constantly reminded that Romans 8:28 says that "all things work together for good to those that love God". I was being lead back to that the fact that our Heavenly Father is *always* there for us, always good, always forgiving, always loving and that He *always* has the ultimate, perfect plan (Jeremiah 29:11) that we cannot see. There is NOTHING that touches our lives without some benefit---God was showing me so clearly that He wants to teach us, refine us, and transform us all into His image. Sometimes in order for Him to accomplish those things, He will allow incidents to happen and we possibly won't ever understand them. I know that God never makes a mistake and that He will never forsake us, leave us or forget us, rather in ALL things He is readying us to be like Him.

We can take all of our questions and fears to Him. The Bible tells us that He loves to hear our intimate thoughts and emotions and He will not be offended. (I Peter 5:7 NIV)- "Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you." We can lean on Jesus every day, every hour and every minute with every problem we face... we <a href="https://example.com/have-to-Trust His ways">have-to-Trust His ways</a> even when we don't understand. He can and will bring the good out of the bad, life out of death, and hope out of despair.




