# A NOTE FROM RODNEY

### **DIVINE DETOX**

On March 2, we begin the Season of Lent with Ash Wednesday. The journey through Lent into Easter is an invitation to examine our lives, to empty out the "junk in our trunk," and let go of everything that restrains our walk with Jesus. In contemporary language, Lent is sort of a "Divine Detox" of bad habits, old ways of thinking, and ourselves. During Lent God calls us to "lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely . . . and to look to Jesus." The 12th Chapter of Hebrews expresses it well.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

Between March and Easter let's unplug from ourselves and re-connect with God this Lenten Season. Here are three suggestions!

- **1.** I invite you to start at PCC's Ash Wednesday Service, 6:30 on March 2. We will hold a brief service with the imposition of ashes.
- 2. During Lent we can stop 10 minutes a day to read and reflect on Richard Rohr's book, "Wondrous Encounters: Scripture for Lent." There are copies available for each of us in the Church Office. We will meet before worship at 10am on March 6, in the Downstairs Fellowship Hall to begin using Rohr's book. Then on Sunday, April 10, we will meet again before the service to prepare for Holy Week. On each Wednesday, we will send out a Lenten devotional over the phone. I look forward to leading this study and to our forty days of Lent together.

3. Make a new effort to worship together in our beautiful sanctuary on all the Sundays of Lent. Make this a time of receiving God's love for you. We have great services ahead for Palm Sunday and Easter.

Together in Lent - Let's Unplug and Re-Connect to the Lord!

Ash Wednesday is Wednesday, March 2, and is always celebrated 46 days before Easter Sunday and marks the beginning of the Lenten Season. Lent is traditionally a 40 day fast and references the time Jesus spent being tempted in the desert. This time seeks to prepare the heart of the believer for the solemn remembrance of Jesus' death. It concludes and is followed by a joyous Easter Sunday celebration of the resurrection of our Lord and Savior! Ash Wednesday is a penitent service that uses ash to mark the sign of the cross on the believer's forehead, symbolizing our sinful nature and our need for salvation. The use of ashes in the Bible symbolizes mourning, repentance and the frailty of humanity.

Genesis 3:19- "By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food until you return to the ground from it you were taken, for dust you are and to dust you will return." Job 42:5-6: "My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you; therefore, I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes."


### SPRING HAS SPRUNG!



### Notes From Tim

And God said to Moses: "Thus you shall say to the sons of Israel - YHWH, the God of your fathers, God of Abraham, God of Isaac, God of Jacob, has sent me to you. This is an everlasting name of mine and for memorial of generations to generations." Exodus 3:15

There was a moment when Moses asked God what his name is. God was gracious enough to answer, and the name He gave is recorded in the original Hebrew as YHWH. When I was taking Hebrew in Seminary, I remember our class discussion of this passage and this explanation: Over time we've arbitrarily added an "a" and an "e" in there to get YaHWeH, presumably because we have a preference for vowels. But scholars and Rabi's have noted that the letters YHWH represent breathing sounds, or aspirated consonants. When pronounced without intervening vowels, it actually sounds like breathing. YH (inhale): WH (exhale). So a baby's first cry, his first breath, speaks the name of God. A deep sigh calls His name – or a groan or gasp that is too heavy for mere words. Even an atheist would speak His name, unaware that their very breathing is giving constant acknowledgment to God. Likewise, a person leaves this earth with their last breath. So when I can't utter anything else, is my cry calling out His name? Being alive means I speak His name constantly. So, is it heard the loudest when I'm the quietest? In sadness, we breathe heavy sighs. In joy, our lungs feel almost like they will burst. In fear, we hold our breath and have to be told to breathe slowly to help us calm down. When we're about to do something hard, we take a deep breath to find our courage.

When I think about it, our breathing is giving God praise. Even in the hardest moments! This is so beautiful and fills me with emotion every time I grasp the thought. God chose to give himself a name that we can't help but speak every moment we're alive. All of us, always, everywhere. Waking, sleeping, breathing, with the name of God on our lips.
