

On Sunday morning, October 1, we will celebrate World Communion Sunday at the 11:00 worship service.

The World Communion Sunday tradition was begun by Hugh Thomson Kerr, a Presbyterian minister, in 1930, whose goal was to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity in which each congregation could experience a sense of interconnection one with another.

In 1940, the National Council of Churches, led by Rev. Jesse Moren Bader, a Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) minister, endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Disciples of Christ churches worldwide and to other denominations.

World Communion Sunday offers individual worshippers and congregations a distinctive opportunity to experience Holy Communion (The Lord's Supper) in the context of the global community of faith. That special day has become a time when Christians in every culture can together break the bread and pour the cup to remember and affirm Christ as the head of the church.

Christians celebrate the Lord's Supper in as many ways as there are congregations, whether sacramental or non-sacramental, liturgical or non-liturgical, confessional or non-confessional in faith and practice. But, the word "eucharist" still carries the same universal definition — "thanksgiving!" Thankfully, World Communion Sunday can be both a profound worship experience and a time for learning more about the wider community of faith.

Plan to be with us on Sunday October 1, as we together observe this very meaningful Sunday in the life of Christ's holy church.
